### **Business**

Christmas dinner last donors have been lined up. We have received a fantastic response. We still need paper products and plasticware as well as centerpieces. Pick-up is still needed Christmas Eve morning. We are looking for a volunteer to cook a turkey or two. Temporary storage (disposable Tupperware) containers would be useful.

Inspections from regulatory services are happening at 2600 block of Central Highland market. Holland residents have said it degrades the neighborhood. There will be a hearing tomorrow in city hall. Impact statements will be useful for a hearing early next year.

### **Elections**

Board Elections Emily Quast elected as new board member.

Current members voted for one year extention to their terms of current officers.

### **SAFE Report**

10 people showed up for block club training and 9 became new block leaders.

Crime still trending down in 2<sup>nd</sup> Precinct.

The public defender's office tried to change prosecution penalty for felony drug possession but a good turn out and impact statements on the 15<sup>th</sup> of Nov (sentencing guidelines) caused it to be table indefinitely. In response, the Sentencing Guidelines Commission may propose changes to presumptive sentence. Changes must go through legislature, but the Legislature does not pass as a majority vote, rather they can choose to veto it or not. The Commission is attempting to make things more lenient for not just drugs, but gun crimes as well. We will get an update next month's meeting.

### **Inspector's report**

2<sup>nd</sup> Precinct has had a great year of crime statistics - 8% reduction in crime. 2<sup>nd</sup> is the only precinct in city with reductions. Violent crime is down 11 % (2<sup>nd</sup> place). 2<sup>nd</sup> will lead the city in crime reduction. Performance has led this effort. Property crimes are down 7%. Investigations have been responsible for driving property crimes down.

Age of staff and priorities have changed, but community support has remained strong for the police. Moral is very strong in the 2<sup>nd</sup> Precinct..

We will not be losing officers. We are seeking more cops for our developing entertainment areas. 13 cops are graduating out of academy and a larger class will be starting. 60% of the precinct's cops are over 40 years old, and ¼ of the department could be lost in the next 5 years. We will need to hire to anticipate this trend. Last 20 years has been a huge transformation with technology and new equipment.
